### How to get started (and you probably already have):

#### STEP 1 Pick a language

- Arabic
- Chinese
- French

#### STEP 2 Take two classes (or more, if you want)

- 1 class in a foreign language
- 1 class in any discipline with an intercultural, international, or global context

**OR**

- Major or minor in a language, linguistics, or TESOL

#### STEP 3 Do things you want to do (or are already doing)

Participate in 5 to 15 experiences such as:

- Study abroad for a semester or summer
- Attend intercultural lectures, events, or language club meetings
- Work as a CSLC peer tutor
- Complete an internship abroad
- Do independent or faculty-directed research abroad or using another language
- Engage in community-based service in a different culture or language in the U.S. or abroad
- Use foreign language sources in a senior thesis or research project
- Earn a proficiency certification in a language

#### STEP 4 Share what you've learned

- Complete an easy-to-make ePortfolio
- Write an essay or record a video reflecting on the insights you've gained about another culture
